Lou Reid and Carolina
(Union Grove, North Carolina)

Lou Reid is a former winner of the IBMA Emerging Artist of the Year Award and he is arguably the most recognizable voice in Bluegrass music. Lou started as a bass player with Doyle Lawson and Quicksilver, played banjo on the first #1 Country hit to feature a banjo (Ricky Skaggs' *Thank God I'm A Country Boy*), played guitar and sang high tenor with The Seldom Scene, and currently plays mandolin and sings lead both with the Seldom Scene and with his own band Lou Reid and Carolina.



Lou Reid and Carolina won the 2010 SPBGMA Song of the Year for the song *Amanda Lynn*, and in 2011 they received a GMA Dove Award's Song of the Year nomination for the song *It's So Hard To Stumble* (when you're down on your knees).

The band has had three #1 and many other top hits on the Bluegrass charts.

The group has recently added guitarist extraordinaire and great bass/baritone singer Skip Cherryholmes to the group. Skip's family band The Cherryholmes were IBMA Entertainers of the Year in 2005 and had several Grammy nominations for Best Bluegrass Album (2006, 2007, and 2008).

The Byron Berline Band (Guthrie, Oklahoma)

The band provides an upbeat and creative blend of Bluegrass, Western Swing, and more.

Byron's accomplishments include being a three-time National Fiddle Champion as well as a member of three-time IBMA Instrumental Group of the Year (California). He was nominated for two Grammy Awards for his solo album Fiddle and a Song.

Byron's early career included playing fiddle with bluegrass legends such as Bill Monroe, Dillard and Clark, and Country Gazette. His long list of performing and recording credits includes The Rolling Stones, The Eagles, The Band, The Byrds, Elton John, Alabama, Mary Chapin Carpenter, The Flying Burrito Brothers, Rod Stewart, John Denver, Earl Scruggs, Emmylou Harris, Tammy Wynette, Mason Williams, Bob Dylan, Willie Nelson and Vince Gill. He also has extensive television and movie sound track credits and has appeared in Star Trek, Blaze, Back To The Future III, and Basic Instinct.

The rest of his musicians are excellent as well and have won awards and played with many noted bands and stars in the industry.
